## **Area Agency on Aging**

- Aging is responsible for setting up services for the older residents of the community.

## **Bus Time**

- Call Bus Time for information on bus schedules and other transit information.

## **Careerlink**

- Assists with your job search. Their services include resume workshops, free career counseling, job search assistance, interview skills training, job fairs, computer training, and free access to a computer lab.

## **Case Management**

- Case Management assists you in finding and accessing inpatient treatment for drug or alcohol issues.

## **Catholic Social Services**

- CSS operates Gabriel House (transitional housing for homeless women/families) and Mother Theresa's Haven (men's emergency shelter).

- Clean Slate provides patient-focused treatment for opioid, alcohol and other drug addictions.

## **Commission on Economic Opportunity**

- CEO offers case management to homeless individuals, material assistance entering new housing, and crisis assistance with utility issues.

## **Community Counseling**

- CCS provides outpatient and partial hospitalization to those experiencing mental health concerns. Crisis workers are available to help in emergencies. Counselors help people make adjustments to life-changing circumstances.

- CAO provides services including cash assistance, the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), help with child care, health care coverage, home heating assistance (LIHEAP), school meals, SelectPlan for Women and long-term living services.

- Help Line is an information and referral service. Help Line maintains an active data listing of over 400 local agencies, as well as over 16,000 additional regional, state and national resources.

## **Northeast Counseling**

- The WIC Nutrition Program helps pregnant women, new mothers, and children up to age 5. Participants receive education on infant and child feeding, child development information and assessments, and vouchers to purchase healthy foods at grocery stores.
